Regulations and Strategic Framework

In answering the questions below, we ask you to be aware of the College’s Strategic Framework and the duties and objects of a College under the Health Professions Act.

Mandate of a Health Professions College - Health Professions Act, Section 16(1)

It is the duty of a college at all times to serve and protect the public, and to exercise its powers and discharge its responsibilities under all enactments in the public interest.

Mission

Protect the public by regulating British Columbia's doctors of chiropractic to ensure safe, qualified and ethical delivery of care.

Strategic Goals:

1. Protect the public by ensuring that registrants deliver professional, effective and ethical services.
2. Reinforce evidence-informed practice by registrants.
3. Improve public trust in the regulator and strengthen productive relationships with our stakeholders.
4. Enhance and clarify governance to support our mandate.

- **Government / Public Policy** - Has experience and knowledge of the College’s broader public policy context including the mandate of Health Regulatory Colleges under the *Health Professions Act* and the relationship of regulatory health colleges to the Ministry of Health. Familiar with relevant legislation such as the *Health Professions Act*, *Chiropractors Regulation, Bylaws* and *Professional Conduct Handbook*. Understands federal and provincial government decision making process and the regulatory environment.
