We, the undersigned registrants of the College of Chiropractors of BC, respectfully request that the following three (3) resolutions be read and considered at the Extraordinary General Meeting on June 5, 2021.

Resolution #1

We acknowledge that the amendments to the Professional Conduct Handbook (PCH) Part 2, Part 15, and Appendix L regarding diagnostic imaging are supported by scientific evidence and best practice guidelines, was developed in accordance with a transparent process that included public consultation, and is in the best interest of the public. We resolve that these amendments be upheld.

Resolution #2

We acknowledge that the Efficacy Claims Policy (<https://www.chirobc.com/wp-content/uploads/2019/12/Efficacy-Claims-Policy-Dec-2019.pdf>) protects the public by reducing false and misleading marketing, and does not inhibit chiropractors' ability or scope. We resolve that the CCBC Efficacy Claims Policy be upheld and updated according to the policy.

Resolution #3

We acknowledge that the research reviews produced by Ontario Tech University have assisted in developing evidence-based regulation in the public interest. We request that this relationship, or a similar relationship with an established research institution, be maintained for the purpose of informing regulation in the public interest using current, unbiased assessments of the evidence.
